GOA-ON: The Global Ocean Acidification Observing Network

- Formed in 2012
- Membership:
 - 148 scientists from 30 countries
 - Executive council co-chaired by Libby Jewett (US NOAA) and Bronte Tilbrook (Australia - CSIRO)

Three Overarching Goals To:

- Improve our understanding of global OA conditions
- Improve our understanding of ecosystem response to OA
- Acquire and exchange data and knowledge necessary to optimize modeling for OA and its impacts

Current Challenges

- Filling large gaps in ocean acidification monitoring (e.g. continent of Africa)
- Building capacity in data-poor regions for local scientists to champion monitoring programs
- Distributing monitoring equipment
- Building and maintaining a central data platform



Holding workshops in regions with limited monitoring capacity/technical expertise to train local scientists


Delivering technology
